

# Challenges

Paul Harris said the main challenge was that the design of the building was all curves.

"Everything in the build was curve shaped — including the walls and the roof. Therefore, there were challenges in setting out to execute the shape and deliver the complex finishes. Every element we fitted had a slight fissure in it to be able to create the curves."

Judges said Te Manawa Atawhai Catherine McAuley Centre is a spectacular building which has captured the rich history of the Sisters of Mercy and their historical relationship with the West Coast.
